On February 27, 2025, we will hold our 27th Annual Optimist Club Chess Tournament!

Each year, our Club invites local primary schools to register their Chess Clubs to play in our annual tournament. Each school can bring up to 4 of their top Chess players from each grade (1 to 8) for a nominal fee of \$10 per child. We typically host 150 students! However last year we had over 200 students participating.

Here's how it works:

On the day of the tournament, schools arrive between 8:30 - 9:00 a.m., and we start the tournament at 9:15 a.m. Students are sectioned off by grade. Each student plays a minimum of 3 games, with the winners playing up to 5 games. The top 3 players of each grade are invited to the Ontario Chess Challenge Finals that occurs in April.

The event is held at the Legion with set up occurring the night before:

 Typically, we start at 5pm and finish well before 7pm, depending on the number of volunteers we have.

Day of we need volunteers for:

- Judges Each judge oversees a grade section to note winners of each round and answer basic Chess regulation questions. (All judges receive training on basic rules.)
- Supervisors To help with activity sheets for children to do in between games.
- Servers & Overseers Help to serve pizza & water, plus volunteers to oversee the tournament to ensure parents & guests stay in their designated area.
- Tear-down The night before and late-afternoon directly after the tournament we need volunteers to help set up tables, chairs and Chess boards, and then put them away.
